2021-22 School Goals

Staff members analyzed our current student data. They anticipated our use of interventions and specific strategies will enable us to increase student levels of performance.

- Grades K-2 Reading: 90% at standard for EOY DIBELS
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 87% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 88% at standard
- Grade 5 science: 80% at standard

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
- Achievement gap: English Language Learners will improve to 36% of EL students (5/14) in grades 3-5 at or above standard in math.
- School Effectiveness: 90% of staff will agree slightly or higher that they receive regular feedback on how they are doing as measured by the Characteristics of School Effectiveness Survey.
- Attendance: We will reduce by 40% the number of students who have 15+ absences in a year from 32 in the 17-18 school year to 19 students in the 18-19 school year.
- Discipline: We will reduce the number of non-IEP/504 students receiving consistent office referrals from 10 to 5 from BOY to EOY.


2021-22 District Expenditures

Where does the money go?




State Assessment Results
